The workshop will teach participants:

- What is Asset Building?
- Guiding Principles & Concepts within a Native Hawaiian context
- Strategies & Models – Overview of Local & National Asset Building Policy & Community Practice
- Resource Mapping – Map Out Resources & Partnerships for Family & Community Self-Sufficiency
- Program Design – Identify Existing Asset Building Opportunities and/or Design an Asset Building Approach that supports Native Hawaiian families and communities

This interactive workshop will provide participants with information on asset building concepts and guiding principles, specific strategies and examples such as Individual Development Accounts (IDAs – matched savings), and opportunities to analyze case studies so that they can design viable initiatives to help Native Hawaiian families and communities build assets. This includes exploring “best practices” and lessons learned for youth asset building; helping families build assets through the *Earn It, Keep It, Grow It, Share It* framework; developing community-based economic development and/or social enterprises; place, culture, and values based initiatives; and asset building policy initiatives. Participants will also map potential resources and partnerships to better understand the potential feasibility, sustainability, and “fit” of asset building strategies that they could develop to complement their efforts working with Native Hawaiian families and communities.
